



and states that it was possible to make it, he is almost certainly right. When he states it was impossible, he is probably right, but could be wrong.

South was in four spades. West led the heart ace and continued with the king. Declarer ruffed and drew two rounds of trumps, getting the bad news. Then he cashed the club ace and played a second club to dummy's queen. East, though, won with his king and led another heart. South was doomed. After ruffing, if he drew trumps before playing a third club, East would cash a couple of hearts. And if declarer immediately played another club, East would immediately win and tap declarer again with a heart, leaving West with one more trump than South.


